

Trinity's Extended Campus Plan

Trinity Catholic School, with the help and guidance from community members and parish members, has come up with a plan to remain open if Massena Central School is asked to close temporarily due to a covid outbreak. The implementation of this plan would only be with permission from our local Department of Health. It is our intent to be able to continue to provide on-site instruction in a safe environment. Although we know that this will cause some difficulties for some families, we hope that by avoiding the greater inconvenience of virtual learning we will be serving our families' needs.

Our plan involves having some students stay at Trinity while others receive instruction at St. Mary's social hall and the classrooms on the second floor, with the purpose of separating students as much as possible.

Students remaining at Trinity are: PreK3, PreK4, JK, Gr.3 and Gr.4 in their rooms and the 2 kindergarten classes distanced in the gym. **This will allow for the grades with the greater number of distanced learners to be at Trinity where the WiFi is better. Each class would be assigned it's own bathroom also. Arrival and dismissal procedures will be the same.

Students at St. Mary's are: Gr.1, Gr.2, Gr.5 and Gr.6. Grade 2 can stay in the social hall distanced, while the other 3 grades use classrooms upstairs. Just as at the main Trinity building, all classrooms and instruction areas would be sanitized daily. All safety protocols would be followed.

By spreading our students throughout our Catholic campus, there will be less students in the hallways which will suppress the spread of germs.

Things to consider:

- Students can still order lunches from our cafeteria. Lunches will be delivered daily to St. Mary's.
- Before and After Care will be available at each site. (7:00-8:15 and 3:00-5:30)
- **Students will not be in class on Mondays** but will be given assignments online.
- Busing will not be available
- Dismissal will still be anytime between 2-3:00 at both sites.
- Our school nurse will be stationed at the main Trinity building, but will travel to St. Mary's in case of an emergency.
